The Criminology program provides students with a comprehensive understanding of crime, criminal behavior, and the criminal justice system. The criminology program offers undergraduate, honours, and graduate degrees. The undergraduate and honours programs enable students to obtain a greater understanding of criminology for careers in related professions or graduate studies. The Master of Arts degree helps students gain advanced knowledge and specialized skills through courses and independent research.

Programs

The Bachelor of Arts (BA) is a well-established, foundational degree and requires the requirements listed below alongside general graduation requirements (<https://smu-ca-public.courseleaf.com/undergraduate/faculties/faculty-arts/bachelor-arts/>).

Major in Criminology

For admission to the program, students must have completed Introduction to Criminology (CRIM 1303), Exploring Criminology (CRIM 2110) and Canadian Criminal Justice System (CRIM 2304). Students must have received a minimum grade of B- in CRIM 2110 and 2304.

To major in Criminology, students must complete thirty-six (36) credit hours as follows:

Honours in Criminology

This is a selective program. Applicants for admission to the Honours program must:

- have completed at least 60 credit hours;
- have completed or be enrolled in

- have declared a major in Criminology
- have a cumulative GPA of at least 3.3 out of 4.3;
- have a cumulative program GPA in Criminology courses of 3.5 out of 4.3;
- have no grade in Criminology courses lower than a C;
- have contacted a faculty member who would be willing to serve as a supervisor for the Honours Thesis Research Preparation (CRIM 4600) and Honours Thesis Writing (CRIM 4601); and
- Students may not begin the honours program prior to having successfully completed

The deadline for applications is January 30 of the academic year before students wish to begin the honours program.

To graduate with honours, students must maintain a cumulative GPA of 3.30 out of 4.3 in Criminology courses at the 2000 level and above. Students must earn a grade of B+ in Honours Thesis Writing (CRIM 4601).

Minor Program in Criminology

For admission to the minor program, students must have completed Introduction to Criminology (CRIM 1303), Exploring Criminology (CRIM 2110) and Canadian Criminal Justice System (CRIM 2304). Students must have received a minimum grade of B- in CRIM 2110 and 2304.

The minor in criminology requires twenty-four (24) credit hours in criminology completed with a minimum grade point average of C. Required courses include:
